1. Course Description

 \cdot Classes are conducted in the form of exercises. Students must read the relevant sections of the text they subscribe to on the day in advance and clarify their questions and impressions before attending the class.

•Students must report at least once or twice. If you are assigned to the reporting role, summarize the appropriate sections of the text that you will be reading that day and summarize your own issues. •Based on the report of the reporter, the participants and teachers will discuss and deepen their understanding
