1. Course Description

Concerning all activities between states and relations with and among other non-state actors including intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations, international relations have been transforming dramatically and become more complexed. With increasing SNS usage by these actors, global issues including racism, climate change, gender (e.g. #MeToo), poverty, human rights and other involving problems are more highlighted than the past, which have also affected various political platforms at any levels. In need of understanding these complicated landscapes of international relations, the skills for critical thinking are particularly important.
