1. Course Description

This course introduces gaining knowledge necessary for taking the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) in five fields (Kanji, Vocabulary, Grammar, Reading, and Listening) for students studying abroad.

The aim of this course is to help students pass the JLPT N1 (or N2) and acquire knowledge especially in the fields of Reading. Lectures are the form in which the teacher gives lessons, and students study in a group (or pairs) accordingly. The course also enhances the development of students' skills in knowledge, comprehension and techniques in the educational goal of General Basic Subjects 2 and 3.

2. Course Objectives

Participants of this course are expected to gain Japanese language skills and problem solving skills (knowledge and comprehension) necessary to pass the JLPT N1 (or N2).

3. Grading Policy

Your overall grade in the class will be decided based on the following:

- 1. Class attendance, attitude, and speaking up in class (20%)
- 2. Assignments (30%)
- *The explanations and correct answers will be posted on the LMS.
- 3. Practice examinations (50%)
- *These are administered in class as midterm or term-end examinations.

To pass, students must earn at least 60 points out of 100.
