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1. Course Description

In this class, we will study about the transition of "Modern Japanese view of nature", from the viewpoint of comparative cultural research. We focus on the transformation of domestic culture and foreign culture in the process of its formation and the internal effect caused by fusion as an example, from the standpoint of comparative culture research. In addition, in order to gain a clue to reconfirm their own culture in international culture, the introduction section of the lecture outlines the perspectives of domestic and international representative research on "culture propagation" and "role of others" as an outline. And while respecting others through these, we aim to pursue identity and to be able to deepen the learning in each specialized field. This lesson is related to study objectives 1, 2, and 3 of general basic subjects.

This course is for JABEE programs, so students in the Information Science Course of the Department of Information and Electronic Engineering and students in other departments will be offered on different days of the week. Please be careful when registering for the course.

2. Course Objectives

Through group works based on the contents of the lecture, standing on the international perspective, looking back the culture attribution, consciously knowing "others", and at the same time, knowing yourselves deeply. Through these, we can gain the useful perspective, in learning specialized fields and living in the society in the future.

3. Grading Policy

There will be no final exam in this class. We will evaluate grades by comprehension of the term-end report (50%) and the attitude in class (50%). Regarding the "attitude in class", we also add the 8th and 15th report submissions to the evaluation.
